Women start acting like their mothers at age 33, study says

A study of a British plastic surgery center with 2,000 respondents found that women begin to act like their mothers when they reach the age of 33.

The research was conducted by Julian de Silva, MD, of the Center for Facial Cosmetology and Plastic Surgery in London....

According to Silva, the signs that show that daughters are turning their mothers includes watching the same television shows, having the same hobbies and speaking the same expressions they speak.

The behavior is also observed in men, but with a year more: they begin to act and speak like their parents at 34. Turning off lights from empty rooms, fattening and talking about politics are constantly among the signs of male transformation.

"We are all going to become our parents at some point in our lives," Silva told the British newspaper "Metro." "And this is something to be celebrated. They are the most wonderful people in our lives," he says.
